It was thus very pleasing to see a large turnout of members for the event which went smoothly, except that the lunch was late in arriving – or was it that the meeting finished early – or was it both! This situation created an opportunity for members to grab a cup of coffee or tea, sit down and have a chat. It was just wonderful to see members enjoying themselves just socialising – something we have not been able to do easily at U3A for some time. As the immunisation program progresses and we continue to have low incidences of Covid in the community, we hope that current restrictions will be eased to the extent that we can return to a situation closer to pre-Covid than we are in at

Thank you for the support members showed in the management committee in re-electing all members of the previous committee. However new members are joining each week and some former members who were hesitant about re-enrolling are now coming back. We are not rushing to build our membership up again, but will take a steady, incremental approach, as we have in the past.

Thank you to all who have been so patient in adapting to all the new procedures we have had to introduce to keep our members as safe as possible under the "Covid circumstances" and to the restrictions some classes have had to face on classroom numbers. We will keep you well informed when these restrictions can be eased.

Covid-19

The Victorian State Government has announced an easing of some restrictions as from midnight on Friday March 26. We have been advised by Monash City Council how these changes affect our occupancy of the Batesford Hub and the Notting Hill Community Centre. Unfortunately nothing much has changed as far as we are concerned in that the room occupancy restrictions, now based only on the 2sqm and 4sqm per person rules, are still the same. It is these rules that are limiting how many members can attend classes in the various rooms that we use. However the wearing of masks is now optional.

Batesford Road Carpark

The management committee has again asked Monash Council to introduce a one-way traffic system in the Batesford Road car park at the Hub similar to that used in the Power Avenue car park. This is to maximise the safety of all those who use the car park which has relatively narrow roadways. We are encouraged by the positive response we have received from our request, but understand that other matters may take higher priority.

In the meantime we request all U3A members who use the car park to proceed in a clockwise direction through the car park as per the diagram below. We will be requesting staff and clients of Ramsay Health (Ground floor occupants) to do the same.


