In talking to other, local, U3A's they have the same problems as we do. Some that use many different facilities have even greater problems in that the rules they have to follow vary between facilities and many are quite small. Even those that use council facilities, as we do, can face very strict conditions of use – in one case having to pay for intensive cleaning at the end of each day! Monash Council Halls officers have been very good in explaining clearly what is expected of us and responding to changes in the regulations very rapidly – for which we are very grateful.

You often do not realise how much some things are important to you until they are not available. That seems to me to be very true of the kitchen facilities at The Hub which was our "centre" of social contact - both within classes and between classes. We really miss the opportunity of a chat over a "cuppa". It is good to see, however, that members are really trying to catch up with each other before and after classes.

As we start term three we can only hope that the external environment will continue to improve and that, with increased rates of vaccination, authorities will have greater confidence to carefully remove restrictions and enable us to return to a fuller "U3A life" together.


I finally told my suitcases there would be no holiday this year. Now I am dealing with the emotional baggage.

Applicants must have had at least one Astra Zenica vaccination at least 3 weeks before auditioning, or be fully immunized with 2 Pfizer injections;


Ability to read music is helpful, but not mandatory. However, you must be able to sing in tune and hold your musical line.

If you have any queries, please leave your name and phone number with the U3A office staff at Batesford, and I will call you.


