## **Emails Going to Spam**

Several members who use Gmail for their Email client have recently reported that an Email from U3A Waverley sent on 12 November entitled UPDATES FOR ENROLMENT PROCEDURES AND COURSES FOR 2022 was identified as SPAM and carried a message that it may be unsafe.

#### The Email was not SPAM and was legitimate.

It appears that this is simply the result of Google being over-zealous in its attempts to protect us from malware. Unfortunately, as the sender, we at U3A Waverley have no *control or influence over this*, but you, as the recipient can take action to prevent it. You can log into your Google account and list the domain <u>U3Awaverley.org.au</u> as a safe sender. It is also good practice to check, and where appropriate, delete your Spam or Junk Emails. This article has some simple instructions about how to add safe senders and domains to your Gmail.




